PASTOR'S NOTE

Greetings, St. Andrew's friends!

Recently, we were asked by the owner of the shopping center across from us on Marrow's Road, to stop parking in their lot. At first, this felt like some kind of punishment. The St. Andrew's community has been parking across the street for years! Quickly, though, two realizations arose.

First, it has never been especially safe – or possibly even faithful – to designate church parking across a busy road. *How can parking be unfaithful?* Well, as we heard from chapter 2 of James on Disability Inclusion Sunday, showing *any* partiality in how we treat people who come to worship God is an unfaithful approach.

Specifically, by asking people to cross Marrows Road, like a live-action version of the old Frogger video game (remember Frogger?), is to show partiality to those people who can do that safely. For a variety of reasons, many of us cannot safely walk across Marrows Road. I will say it plainly: to ask people to undertake unnecessary risk, just to get to church, is unreasonable, and unkind. As a faith community, we need to do better.

That leads me to our second realization: in God, obstacles can become opportunities. By losing our traditional parking, we have gained a closer relationship with our friends across Kensington Avenue, at Gusto Grill. We are welcome to park at their restaurant while we worship. That is generous of our neighbors, and good news in the life of our church. Also good news is the taste of Gusto Grill's beef shawarma we enjoyed at our picnic – but don't take my word for it – support those who support us!

Beyond the generosity of our neighbors, though, this change in parking is forcing us to ask difficult, even unflattering questions about where we have been, and what direction we might take next. Is this the right time for us to invest in on-campus parking? Should we partner with our neighbors at Kingswood Methodist Church, as we do at Easter, to jointly address our shared parking needs? Is the right answer something we have not even considered? Here's a tough one: who are we excluding by making church harder to attend? Oof.

While the final answers are likely not yet close, I am proud of how St. Andrew's leadership has responded. Rather than looking in the rearview mirror with angry eyes, your Session has decided to explore the needs of the congregation *today*. Rather than lament what *was*, we are asking, *what next?* I do not know where this conversation is going, but I am excited to be a part of what St. Andrew's does to best serve our community in the years to come. I hope you will come along for the ride.

DOLLAR\$ AND \$EN\$E - THE BOTTOM LINE

In August, St. Andrew's received \$7,455.96. That amount is \$1,860.71 less than the \$9,316.67 budgeted for the month. We spent \$6,575.82 in August. That is \$1,360.94 less than the budgeted expenses of \$7,936.76. Year to date, we have received \$70,481.07, which is \$4,052.29 less than the budgeted \$74,533.36. Since January 1, St. Andrew's has spent \$69,024.41 which is \$5,530.33 more than the budgeted \$63,494.08.

There were no expenditures for operations \$500 or greater. All expenses were normal. Thank God.

The surplus for the month was \$880.14. The surplus for the year is \$1,456.66.

Reserves at the end of August - \$158,722.76, an increase of \$18,810.36 (13.4%) for the month. Our reserves have increased \$2,102.13 (1.3%) since January 1, 2024. Even after paying \$35,840.00 for a new roof, roof repairs, gutters and downspouts and transferring \$14,485.00 to the Cup Runneth Over fund, a total of \$50,325.00, we are still ahead for the year. Amazing! Thank you, Jesus!


There were five Cup Runneth Over expenditures in August - \$789.00 for past due rent and \$1,619.88 for past due Delmarva Power bills. The total for Cup Runneth Over in August was \$2,408.88. The amount remaining in the fund on 8/31/24 is \$11,721.85. Since its inception in 2022, the Cup Runneth Over Fund has used \$19,794,16 of the available \$31,516.01 to help our neighbors in need. If you or anyone you know has a critical need, please bring it to the attention of anyone on our committee - Darrell DiStefano, Julie Guns, Tracy Hardy, Brenda Saulsbury or Pastor Matt Waters. All Cup Runneth Over requests are strictly confidential.

I thank you all for your financial commitment to St. Andrew's. I also thank everyone at St. Andrew's for their faithfulness, patience, understanding and grace and pray for God's guidance as we go forward in service.


